The white grapes commonly grown in Bordeaux include Sauvignon Blanc, Sémillon, Muscadelle, Colombard and Ugni Blanc, although most white Bordeaux are a blend of Sémillon and Sauvignon Blanc. There are two major styles of white Bordeaux produced, light & fruity styles make up the majority but rich & creamy whites are produced in Pessac-Leognan.

LOIRE VALLEY

The Loire Valley is the most diverse wine region in France producing exemplary wines in every style although it is best known for crisp, dry whites. Typical grapes grown here include Sauvignon Blanc, Muscadet, and Chenin Blanc. In general the wines have refreshing acidity and minerality which makes them ideal wines to pair with food.

RHÔNE VALLEY

The vineyards of the RhôneValley have been producing wine for at least 2000 years. RhôneValley wines derive their style, richness and originality from the diversity of the region's grape varieties. In the north, some of the world's longest-lived wines are produced, mostly rare and aromatic whites. There are three great grapes of the Northern Rhône: Viognier, Marsanne and Roussanne. In the south a large variety of grapes are grown and blended including Grenache Blanc, Picpoul, Roussanne and Marsanne.

GERMANY

Germany produces wine in a wide variety of styles; dry, semi-sweet and sweet white wines, sparkling wines, called Sekt, rosé wines and red wines. The main white grape grown is Riesling, where wines are classified according to increasing sweetness. Germany also produces many good quality wines using international and local grape varieties.

SPAIN

Spain has over 2.9 million acres of vines, making it the most widely planted wine producing nation. The country has an abundance of native grape varieties although 80 percent of the country's wine production is from only 20 grape varieties, including the whites Albariño from Galicia, Palomino, Airen, and Macabeo.

AUSTRIA

Austria is the home of Gruner Veltiner which is considered the widest planted variety. Austria also produces medium and full-bodied dry Rieslings with citrus and stone fruit flavours and medium or high acidity. Wines from certain vineyards sometimes have smoky, mineral aromas which gain complexity as they age.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

American wine has been produced for over 300 years. Today California is producing 89 percent of all US wine followed by New York, Washington and Oregon. Chardonnay is one of the leading grape variety for the production of high end wines, and they tend to be quite similar to the Burgundies with most often a longer barrel ageing, giving very complex and fine wines.

ARGENTINA

The most important wine regions of the country are located in the provinces of Mendoza which produces more than 60 percent of Argentinian wine. There are many different varieties of grapes cultivated in Argentina although Torrontés is the most common white grape. Other international varieties including Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Gris are becoming more widely planted.
